This is my last contribution to the EFI newsletter as President. It has truly




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

been an honour to serve the society in this office. The most enjoyable part is the interactions I have with the members of the Executive Committee during our meetings. We have dealt with several challenges over the years and I feel that we have worked well as a team, to ensure the continued operation of our organisation for the benefit of our members. My thanks to all the Executive Committee members (past and present) for your support, and a special thanks to Dave Roelen who in addition to being the EFI Secretary, has the responsibility for managing the EFI office in Leiden.

I also welcome two new councillors to the Executive Committee; Katerina Tarassi from Greece and Sandra Tafulo from Portugal who will take up their positions as I step down during the General Assembly in Geneva. I wish you well in your roles supporting EFI.

The real EFI work is undertaken by the EFI committees: Accreditation, Education, External Proficiency Testing (EPT), IT & Bioinformatics, Scientific, and Standards. The chairs and members work tirelessly to achieve their goals to ensure we have the appropriate structures in place to support our members. The most definite highlights from the last few years include the progress made by the Education Committee with the introduction of the ETHIQ diploma. We should all be proud that our organisation has successfully delivered a training programme that targets junior members of our laboratories and I hope that this programme is able to develop and be used by members from many different countries that do not have their own training programme.

So we have training for technical staff, and together with the UEMS we have an examination for staff at the laboratory director stage of their career. Our laboratories remain

accredited and the efforts made by the Accreditation Committee to streamline the processes involved will ensure that the programme remains effective. The Standards Committee ensures that the standards that those of us in clinical testing laboratories work with are kept updated and much work is going into the production of a completely new version to incorporate advances in the challenges we encounter with handling big data, an area of interest for our IT and Bioinformatics Committee.

The Scientific Committee has responsibilities including review of the abstracts for the annual conference and applications for the Julia Bodmer Award. They also nominate the recipient for EFI's prestigious award: The Ceppellini Lecture. This year the recipient of the award is Professor Jamie Rossjohn, from Monash University, Australia. Professor Rossjohn's research has focused on the use of structural methods to enable a greater understanding of how T-cells function in the generation of immune responses against different antigen types. Congratulations to Professor Rossjohn and I look forward to hearing his lecture in Geneva.

I wish to thank Helle Bruunsgaard for her time as chair of the EPT Committee, who has stepped down after three years. The EPT Committee plays an important role in providing standards for providers of EPT schemes ensuring that the proficiency testing undertaken by laboratories meets the standards required for clinical care and also EFI accreditation. Most recently the committee has been updating the process for inter-laboratory exchanges which can be utilised when no established EPT scheme exists for a particular test, for example testing for MICA antibodies. We do not know who the replacement for Helle will be, and in the meantime my thanks to Yvonne Zoet for taking over as interim chair.

I began my presidency with the fallout from the pandemic. A significant portion of EFI's income is derived from the benefits of our annual conference. As we did not have a conference in 2020, and 2021 was virtual, this income source was severely depleted. However due to the successful management of the EFI finances by the current and past Treasurer and the successes of the Amsterdam and Nantes conferences, and anticipated success in Geneva, we are back in a safe situation.

So I feel that I am handing the EFI mug to Professor Marco Andreani with an EFI organisation that is in a good situation. It has been a pleasure working with Marco during the last year in his role as President Elect. Marco has much experience of EFI matters due to having been a member of the Education committee, an EFI Commissioner and an Executive Committee Councillor. He is truly committed to the EFI cause. I am confident that EFI is in excellent hands for the future. I wish Marco and his Executive Committee all the very best for the next three years (and of course beyond).

Of course you are only reading this letter due to the work undertaken by Sebastiaan Heidt our EFI newsletter editor. Thank you Sebastiaan for all the work you do for the newsletter which keeps our members up to date with all the EFI activities.

Update from the EFI Education Committee

EFI Continued Medical Education (CME) / Continued Professional Development (CPD)

We are launching EFI CPDMe at the EFI Conference with a session planned on Tuesday 21st May 13:30-14:30 (see more information of the launch meeting in this Newsletter). Activities can be recorded under 4 different categories (Educational, Clinical, Professional or Academic) and self-reflective notes and other supporting documentation can be linked to each activity. A visual summary allows direct oversight of your CME/CPD activities, and an annual statement (suitable for EFI Accreditation applications) can be produced when required.

The system will be easy to access - available via a link on the EFI website.

European Specialisation in H&I (ESHI) Diploma

The next examinations will take place on the 19th May 2024 in Geneva, with an application deadline of 7th April 2024. The ESHI exams, aimed at EFI Directors/Co-Directors and

those working towards this level, are offered at two time points each year; in Spring as an in person oral exam at the EFI annual conference, and in Autumn as an online oral exam. Information regarding of the expected level of training and experience, the application process and details of the next round of exams can be found at the UEMS website: Transplant Immunology - UEMS Section of Surgery (uemssurg.org)

The first ESHI Diploma examinations took place 10 years ago and since the start of the ESHI exam in 2014 we have had 49 applicants. In 2024, the 10-year Anniversary of the exam, we will pass the 50 applications milestone!

European Technical H&I Qualification (ETHIQ)


This training programme provides a qualification that gives a measure of both knowledge and technical competence in H&I. The scheme is for technical staff working in EFI accredited laboratories, with supervision given by senior staff in their own lab. Information about the training

programme, registration process and deadlines can be accessed on the EFI website: https://efi-web.org/e-learning/ethiq-for-technical-staff.

There will be 2 intakes each year and the registration deadlines will be 1st January and 1st July. The portfolio is completed on-line, and the content of logbook is in English, although trainees can complete evidence in their own language. The final multiple-choice assessment is currently in English, however we have translated into French and work is progressing to complete translations in German, Italian and Spanish. These translations will then be uploaded to the Moodle platform so students will have an option to take the final assessment in a language other than English.

20 students were registered for the training programme in July 2023 from 7 different countries across Europe. A further 11 students registered for the training program in January 2024 giving a total of 31 students from 10 countries across Europe.



EFI/ASHI/APHIA/ARSHI International Summer School

The next International Summer School hosted by ASHI was scheduled to be held on April 14 - 17, 2024 in Merida, Mexico. Unfortunately, the organisers have had to postpone the 2024 ISS to 2025. The location will remain the same - Fiesta Americana Merida Hotel, Merida, Mexico and the dates are likely to be April 2025. This means the ISS due to be hosted by EFI in 2025 will now take place in 2026. Applications are being reviewed currently to assess the impact of this change.

EFI Education and Scientific Bursaries

Applications for Education and Training Bursaries up to a maximum of €1500 to promote training in the field of H&I by enabling visits to other laboratories, are now being received four times each year. Details of the closing dates, the process and the online application form are available on the EFI website bursaries page http://www.efi-web.org/bursaries.html.

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

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Update from the EFI External Proficiency Testing Committee

Meetings: The last External Proficiency Testing Committee (EPTC) meeting took place in October 2023. A meeting is planned during the EFI Conference in May 2024.

Focus: It was decided during the last meeting that the EPTC will have to address and develop strategies for current EFI accreditation categories without established EPT schemes and new upcoming analyses such as donor derived cell-free-DNA.

Presentation of new members of the EPTC: The EPTC welcomes two new members of the EPTC who are stepping up for vacant positions. Maria Chiara de Stefano, Rome, Manager of the Italian National External Proficiency Testing for Histocompatibility and Immunogentics laboratories and coordinator of the Italian National EPT Steering Committee in Immunogenetics is the new representative for Region 7 (Italy). María José Herrero Mata, director of HLA laboratory, Banc de Sang i Teixits, Barcelona, Spain is the new representative for Region 9+10 (Spain and Portugal). The EPTC looks forward to a fruitful collaboration.

Vacant positions in the EPTC: This will be my last newsletter as a chairperson for the EPTC. I would like to express my deep gratitude for the opportunity to serve as a member and later as the chairperson of the EPTC. It has been an enriching experience, and I am sincerely thankful to all the EPTC members who have been like an EFI family to me. I would also like to express my gratitude for the collaboration with the EFI office, chairpersons from the other EFI committees, the Executive Committee, and the whole EFI society. Yvonne Zoet from Region 2 (the Netherlands) has accepted to step up as the interim chairperson for the EPTC for now while the vacancy is advertised. Additionally, there is a vacant position for Region 1 (Scandinavia and Baltic countries) that will be announced soon.

Update from the EFI Accreditation Committee

The Accreditation Committee and its Permanent Commission are intensively preparing for Annual Inspectors' Workshop which will take place in Geneva the day before the opening of the 37th EFI Conference. Attendance at the Annual Workshops, which are the cornerstone of continuing education, is requested at least every second year for each active inspector. This year, we are very happy to host Sam Ho, American Society for Histocompatibility & Immunogenetics Accreditation Review Board Program Director, and learn more about the processes in our sister organization. When trying to understand better long-term tight bonds between ASHI and EFI I came across our standards from 1992. Since there is no version of the document mentioned, I assume it is the original – first EFI Standards with clear statement that they were adopted from ASHI, showing the importance of collaboration between the sister organisations.

transplant patients. Recently, FACT sent us the Guidelines for Histocompatibility Standards and Accreditation Programs Evaluation for agencies that wish to be approved by FACT for this service. We prepared the requested extensive document to the best of our knowledge and strive to get prolonged approval for the EFI Accreditation Programme by FACT.



The motto of the conference was "Back to the Future of Immunogenetics". Ingrid Fae and Zorana Grubic, commissioners for EFI region 5 (Central and East Europe), and myself attended the conference. In the scope of EFI matters Ingrid and Zorana presented state of the art of the laboratories in their region, and I gave an update of the EFI Accreditation Programme. We were happy to see many participants still present at this last conference session and answer questions that revealed interest in our business.
